Catherine Polk – Pastry Chef, female, Black, age 40. The heart of the Cataract House – surrogate mother, sister to many of the staff. Born in Baltimore, MD. (Vocal Range -Alto or Mezzo Soprano)

Albert Jones – Cook, male, Black, age 33. Married to Martha Jones. From North Carolina (Vocal Range- Tenor, Baritone)

John Morrison – Head Waiter, male, Black, age 44. The head of the staff, guide, mentor, and hero. Humble in his work, but commands respect from all, including his employers. Originally from Illinois, half Cherokee. Born 1819. Nee Samuel Taylor. (Vocal Range – Tenor, Baritone)

Louis Hamilton – Waiter, male, Black, age 35. Efficient, friendly- from Washington, D.C. Eventually opens Hamilton's General Agency and Intelligence Office. (Vocal Range Tenor, Baritone)

James Patterson – Waiter, male Black, age 23. From Tennessee. (Vocal Range – Tenor, Baritone)

Jerome Jeffrey – Waiter, male, Black, age 23. From Louisiana. (Vocal Range – Tenor, Baritone)

Luke Green – Waiter, male, biracial, age 22. Educated, Deaf and mute. Bilingual French/English – from New Orleans reads/writes.

Samuel Bonds – nee Michael Taylor-newest waiter, male, Black, age 20. Served in the Home of Major Taylor-uses the pseudonym of Samuel Bonds. Has left his parents behind. He is John's nephew. From Illinois. (Vocal Range – Tenor, Baritone)

Hotel Owner – Solon Whitney – Owner-male, White, age 34.- Newlywed, female, White, mid 40's from St. Louis.

Nancy Berry – Servant to Mary Berry, female, Black, age 18. From St. Louis MO. (Vocal Range – Mezzo Soprano)

Mary Berry – Newlywed, female, White, mid 40's from St. Louis MO. Married to Henry Cox. Is both fond and jealous of Nancy. She is Older than her new husband. (Vocal Range – Mezzo Soprano, Alto)

Henry (H.S.) Cox – Leather Barron from Philadelphia, male, White, 30's newly wedded to Mary Berry.

Ruth Howland – Guest of the Cataract Hotel, female, white, age 30's-40's.

Blackwell – Guest and slaveholder of Martha, male White, 50's. From North Carolina.

Martha Jones – Recently escaped/wife to Albert Jones, female, Black, age 30's. From North Carolina. (Vocal Range- Mezzo, Soprano, Alto)

Ensemble – Numerous flexible people who double as waiters (Black), Samuel's Mother (Black) and residents of Niagara Falls (Various races.) (Vocal Ranges Soprano,, Mezzo Soprano, Alto, Tenor, Bass).
